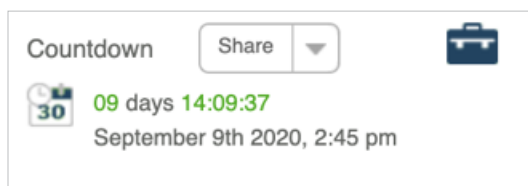

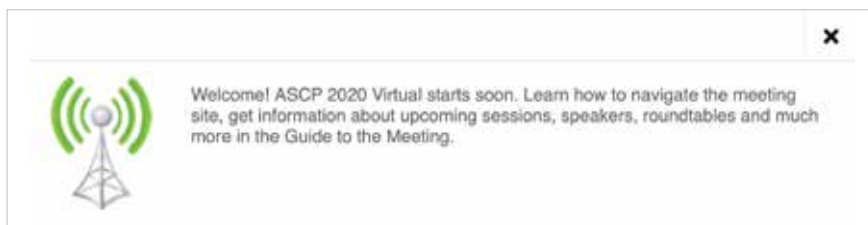


Tip: You will see signs and text throughout the meeting space, much of it is clickable. Take some time to look around, there is a lot to discover!

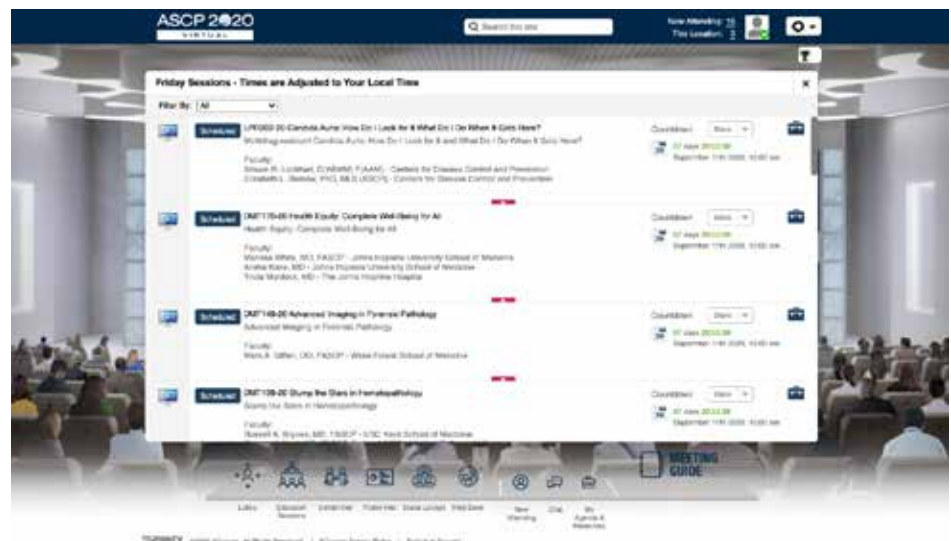
Navigating (Continued)
